





World Cancer Day was started in the year 2000. It was established at the World Summit Against Cancer held in Paris on February 4th, 2000.


SIGNIFICANCE OF THE **EVENT**


INTRAMURAL SPORTS 2024-2025

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
COLLEGE MAGAZINE LAUNCH 20/03/2025




